The Coin Harvey House is listed on The National Register of Historic Places for the following reasons:

1. The house was designed and built in 1874 by William Hope Harvey, who was a lawyer, teacher, economist, author, miner and land developer.
2. The house boasts political significance, as Harvey was a candidate for President of the United States, in 1932.
3. Harvey designed and built this “Architecturally Perfect” house, which became an important early Huntington landmark.
4. The house features many artistic embellishments, which include: stained glass windows, a cast iron marbled mantel and beautiful hand-painted wall murals.
5. The house sits in a central location near Downtown Huntington, with potential as a tourist destination.

The house was a gift from Lenora Kaiser to the “E.J. and Lenore Kaiser and David Gerlach Foundation,” doing business as The Coin Harvey House.

Many interior and exterior structural improvements are complete. Architects are finishing the final plans for restoration, necessary additions and landscaping.

Financing:

\$150,000 has already been raised toward the ultimate goal of \$500,000.
